Group Size

Group rates are available for parties of 10 or more. If numbers drop below 10, standard pricing applies.



Group Pricing

Discounted pricing varies by show and is set by the presenter. Available group rates will be listed on the ticketing website.



Reservations & Payment

Groups may reserve seats in advance, with the option to confirm final numbers and submit payment once attendance has been finalized, subject to availability and venue timeline.



Performance Times

Weekday matinee performances are available for select shows, in addition to weekend and evening performances, making scheduling convenient for motorcoach tours and local groups alike.



Seating & Accessibility

Wheelchair seating is available, and the entire main floor of the theatre is fully accessible by elevator, ensuring a comfortable experience for all guests.

Group Booking Policies



Late Seating

Late arrivals will be seated at a suitable break in the performance when possible, at the discretion of front of house staff. Seating is not guaranteed.



Group Adjustments & Cancellations

Group numbers may be adjusted up to 30 days before the performance; additional tickets may be added after this date subject to availability. All group sales are non-refundable.

To hold your group's spot, a non-refundable deposit equal to 10% of the tickets held is due 30 days prior to showtime. You'll confirm final numbers one month before the show – or sooner if the performance is filling up – on a date you'll arrange when you book.



Weather Considerations

Performances proceed as scheduled unless cancelled by the presenter, in which case standard ticket policies apply.



Arrival Recommendations

Groups should arrive 30 minutes before curtain. If you expect to be later, please notify our Box Office by phone or email so we can plan accordingly, or alter your seating if necessary to avoid disruptions.

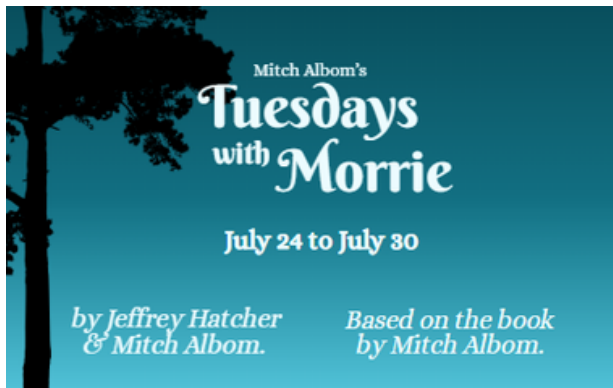

Bus Information



Bus Drop Off

Motorcoaches may drop off passengers at a designated bus area on West Street, near the OOH. This location is for short-term unloading only.



Bus Pick Up

Following the performance, motorcoaches should return to the designated bus lane or stage along Market Street in the OOH parking lot. Please keep wait times brief and ensure your group knows the approximate end time for a timely departure.



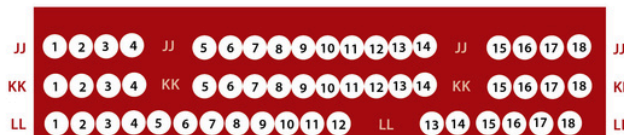
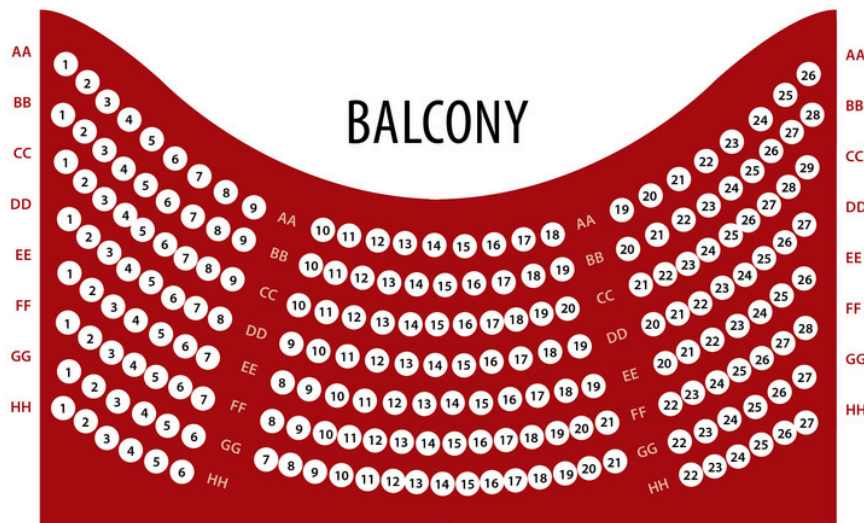
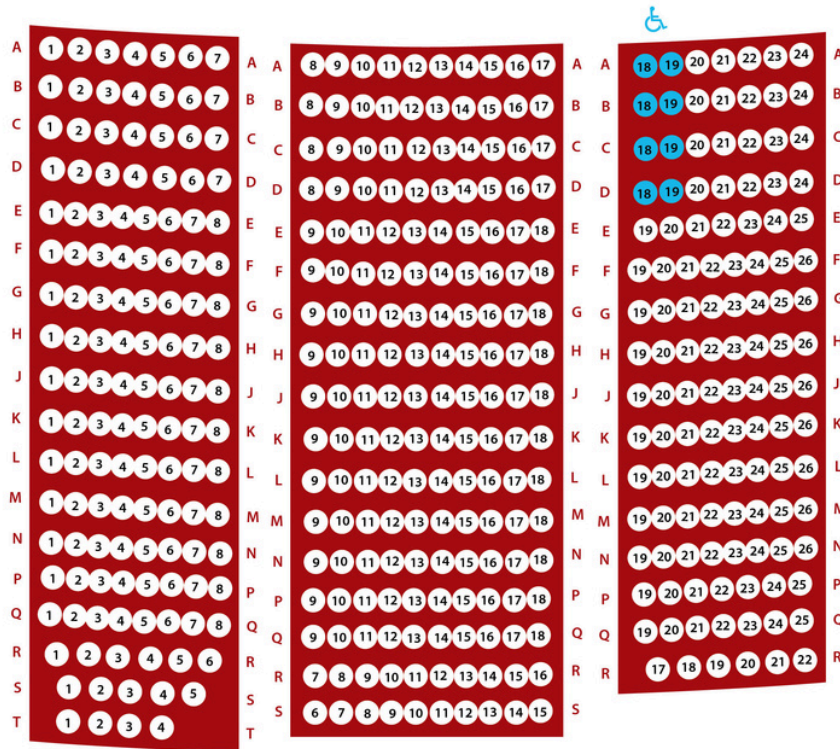
Bus Parking
